Meet Tabitha Pitchford

"When parents say to me, "You just don't understand," I let them know that I actually do understand," says the mom of children aged 15, 12 and 8. "As a parent, you can get so overwhelmed at times with medical appointments, speech pathology and mobility issues - it can be overwhelming. I totally understand that and maybe I can help take some of those challenges away."

Tabitha says that her passion has always been developmental services, thanks in part to her parents who were so involved with the sector. As a family, they volunteered in supporting people with developmental disabilities and imparted those inclusive philosophies to their family. That experience led Tabitha to pursue developmental services as a career.

"I dreamed of working with people who needed support to have their voices heard," she says. "I knew I had the philosophy and foundation growing up, and after college, I had the textbook knowledge. Then I gained the personal experience as a parent."

People often remark to Tabitha that she must have so much patience for her job.
